A Helpful Hint:

Anytime you finish writing code or make changes to your code, you must always “Save”.
If something goes wrong...”Edit/Undo!”

To Save:

On a PC, Save: File Name: “MyFirstWebPage.html”
Save as type: Text Document (.txt)
(I save it to a folder that I create on the desktop)

On a Mac, in order to save this page created by “Text Edit” as a web page:

- Select 'format' -> 'make plain text'
- Select 'File' -> 'save as'
- Save the file as: 'MyFirstWebPage.html'
- You will be asked if you want to use '.html' ... do that.

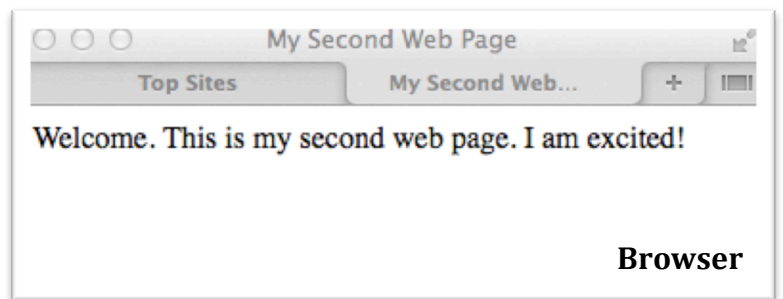
To View Your Web Page

- Open your browser. Now find the file and open it *(MM/File/Open...)*
- You must always refresh your browser after making any changes to a web page.

Now Return to the Webpage you created and make the Edits requested below.

Remember, if one of the changes breaks your web page...Edit Undo!!

1. Change the word “First” in the <Title> to “Second.” Document below the change that occurred after you saved then viewed it in the browser *(remember to refresh)*. (2pt.)
2. Change the word “first” in the <Body> to “second” and document below the change that occurred. (2pt.)

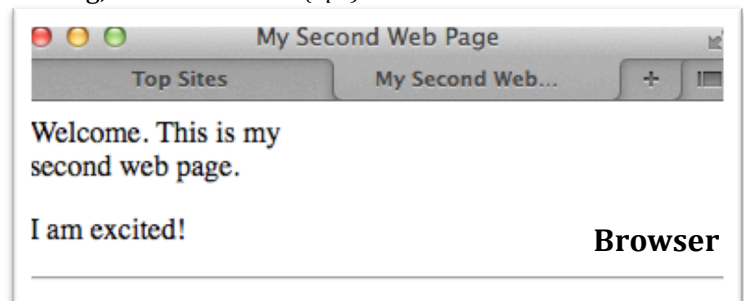

Text or Font <Tags>

| Tag | Description | Tag |

| <h1> <h1>to<h6> | Defines the headings at sizes 1-6. <i>Use Heading Tags on titles!</i> <i>Try the different heading sizes – Notice it automatically applies a line break.</i> | </h1> </h1>to</h6> |
| Standard Font Size -> | Defines standard font sizes. No Longer Supported- Now CSS! <i>The text gets placed here.</i> | |
| | Make the text italics. | |
| | Makes the text Bold. | |
| | Select a standard text color. Place the Tag next to the text. | |
| | Select a hexadecimal color. | |
| <Align="center or left or right"> | Align the text (center, right or left). No Longer Supported- Now CSS! | |
