This weekend, Carpy Gang trounced Calistoga 28-3 in the championship game played in St. Helena. This is just one of many championship trophies the team has brought home, year after year after year. Carpy Gang began in 1952 by David Carpy so that St. Helena boys would have greater exposure to football prior to entering high school. Before this time, St. Helena performed poorly in football against other teams. But Carpy Gang changed all this. David Carpy, a former collegiate player contacted many of his friends, who also played in college. They believed that this was the perfect time to teach these young men how to play football and other real life skills as well.

During Saturday's game, St. Helena took an early lead when running back, Drew Peters, found a hole at the 14 yard line and 86 yards later, entered the end zone. The



team never looked back. Carpy Gang ran for over 220 yards and threw 32 passes for over 280 yards. Coach Jimmy Hoffa, who has been coaching Carpy Gang for 15 years, says that this is probably the most talented group of men he has ever coached. "It takes more than talent, it takes heart and these boys have plenty of that," commented Hoffa.
